ILLUSTRIOUS SIR DAVID L. WALKER 5-20-26 – 7-8-19

Ill. Sir Dave was born in Mankato, Minnesota, and moving shortly thereafter to Davenport, Iowa in 1929. He graduated from Davenport High School in June of 1944. In August of that same year he joined the U.S. Army, where he was assigned to the Third Infantry Division in Europe. Upon his discharge, he entered Augustana College in Rock Island, Illinois, from which he graduated in 1950.

He married Margaret (Peg) Albrecht in Davenport, Iowa, in May of 1951. They met in the church choir following Lady Peg's return from India. Her parents were missionaries and she attended grade school there. They have two sons, David J., Waukesha, Wisconsin, and Paul (MD), in Sylvania, Ohio.

Having worked for a large midwestern auto parts distributor for several years, he joined Champion Spark Plug Company in 1958. Following his early years he provided technical services and training to Champion accounts in nine western and northwestern states, based in

Portland, Oregon. In 1963, he was transferred to Champion's world headquarters in Toledo, and ultimately retired in 1987 as director of automotive technical services. He and his Lady Peg later moved to a Villa at Browning Masonic Community and are members of Waterville Methodist Church of Waterville.

Dave belonged to Rubicon Masonic Lodge and served as Potentate of Zenobia Shrine in 1987. He appointed Noble Bernie Welniak and Lady Dorothy to Zenobia's Shrine line that same year. Illustrious Sir Dave was a long-time member of the Zenobia Shrine Band, where he played the euphonium. His love for music carried over to the Deutschmeister German Band, as well as taking piano lessons, at the age of 77.

In his tenure of Potentate, he founded the Pilots unit. He had a private pilot's license with an instrument rating. Having traveled the world with Champion he and Peg made many cross country trips around the United States in their airplane. He was



a member of Rubicon Lodge #237, as well as the American Legion in Whitehouse. Dave was an active amateur radio operator and active in boating as well.

He and Peg recently celebrated their 68th wedding anniversary.

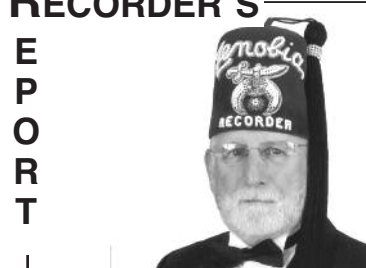

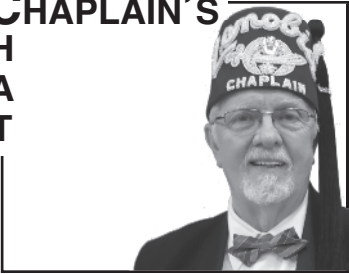

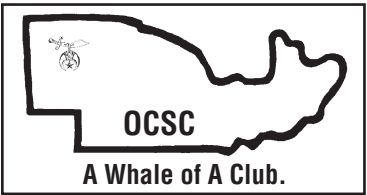
the Circus and suggest you will contact them later for an ad. You can plant the seed while they are buying a chance to win at the raffle.
