

Come out to our stated meetings and spread the word to your Noble friends that maybe you haven't seen in a while. Maybe come to our meeting to see some snowbirds before they head south.


Clubs and units will be getting back in full swing, so get out and support our Nobles and ladies.





By the time you read this the Clowns will have participated in at least four parades and three balloon events in August alone. We have numerous others on the schedule for September and October.


