

JOHN "JACK" W. STOREY PP

May 22, 1927 - February 27, 2021



Zenobia recently lost a fine Mason and Shriner. Ill. Sir John "Jack" W. Storey was called to the celestial lodge on Saturday, February 27, 2021. Jack served as the 1991 Potentate of Zeno-

He was born in Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island, Canada, on May 22, 1927 and moved to Toledo in 1947 to work at Motor Rebuilders and Parts, of which he later became the owner and CEO. In 1948 he met Virginia Heft and they married on June 26, 1954. John became a U.S. citizen in 1956. He served in the U.S. Army from 1952-54 as a paratrooper.

Jack became a Master Mason on October 14, 1948 at Triad Lodge #708, which later merged with Barton Smith Lodge #613, where Storey received his 70-year recognition pin. He was a member of Ft. Meigs Chapter, Toledo Council and Toledo Commandery, joined the Scottish Rite, Valley of Toledo in 1967 and the Shrine in 1969. He served as the Fostoria Shrine Club Ambassador, assistant director of the Directors Staff, ticket chairman for New Year's Party and Potentate's Ball, and the housing chairman for GLSA held in Toledo in 1982. Storey began his leadership role as a Divan member in 1985, when appointed by III. Sir James Teague, then in 1991 served as the Zenobia Potentate. Following this role, he could be seen with a camera around his neck photographing people having fun at the many activities.

We express our sympathy to his lady, Ginny, and his family. Ill. Sir Storey will be remembered as a good Mason, a contributor and leader in the Zenobia Shrine.



sight in this Noble's opinion.





"Our unit used to have 'X' number of members," Noble Larry will say, "Now we're down to 'X' and it'll die unless YOU join."

THE MORAL OF THE STORY: Did you ever buy stock in a company because of how good it "used to be?" Does that inspire consumer confidence? How would telling a new Shriner that he came late to the party make any sense?

The fraternity our new members join is the only one they know—and if they've stuck around to become a Shriner, chances are most of them have found something about Freemasonry that they enjoy. Don't destroy that enthusiasm because the membership numbers aren't the same as it was when you joined. Only enthusiasm breeds enthusiasm.

Again, this was intended as a fun exercise and a chance to laugh at ourselves. Chances are, we're guilty of having been all three of these characters at some

Zenobia Jeepsters will be front and center again this year for the Jeepfest Parade scheduled for Saturday, August 7. Since Jeepfest was canceled last year, 2020 due to COVID-19 restrictions, the Jeepfest organizers are going all out to celebrate Jeep's 80th birthday. After World War II, Willys-Overland Motors, Inc. utilized the Jeep framework and produced 19,132 Jeepsters from 1948 through 1950.

Zenobia Jeepsters participated in the 2018 and 2019 Jeepfest Parades with many of the Jeepsters having VIP passengers. The Jeepster unit was organized in 1964 with 15 members and eight Jeepsters. The Zenobia Jeepster unit increased its membership to more than 85 members of which at least 55 owned a Jeepster.

A large photograph taken in the early 1970's, located at the Zenobia Shrine Center, displays approximately 55 Jeepsters and their owners. This picture also includes an exact one-half scale replica of a 1950 Jeepster named the "Half Pint" by the brothers who made it, Chuck and Warren Ide. They were Jeepster unit members and displayed their "Half Pint Jeepster" many times at the circus and parades. It is now on display at the National Auto and Truck Museum in Auburn, Indiana.
