
THANKS TO SPORTS MEDICINE AT SHRINERS CHILDREN'S CHICAGO, JESSICA IS BACK IN THE GAME

Jessica is a talented athlete who hoped for a bright future in competitive softball. A knee injury took her off the field for almost a year. After a collision during a softball game, Jessica's mom, Kimberly, made an appointment with Chicago Shriners Hospital's sports medicine specialists. The program offers a team approach of pediatric orthopaedic surgeons, onsite physical therapy and return-to-sports testing in the

Gerald Harris Motion Analysis Center. Jessica relied on Shriners' team of sports medicine specialists to help her return to sport with a knee that is strong enough to compete safely again.

Kelsey Davidson, M.D., leads the sports medicine clinic at Shriners Chicago. Jessica had arthroscopic same-day surgery using a patellar tendon graft of her own tissue. After the surgery, Jessica worked

one-on-one with a physical therapist on-site at the Chicago Shriners Hospital.

Jessica's family is very happy with her results. "After our first meeting with Dr. Davidson, we knew that this was where our daughter needed to be," said Kimberly. "Dr. Davidson always had Jessica's best interest in mind and wanted to ensure that she was adequately prepared to return to play."


