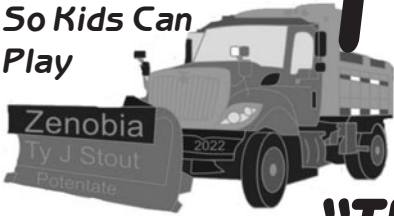

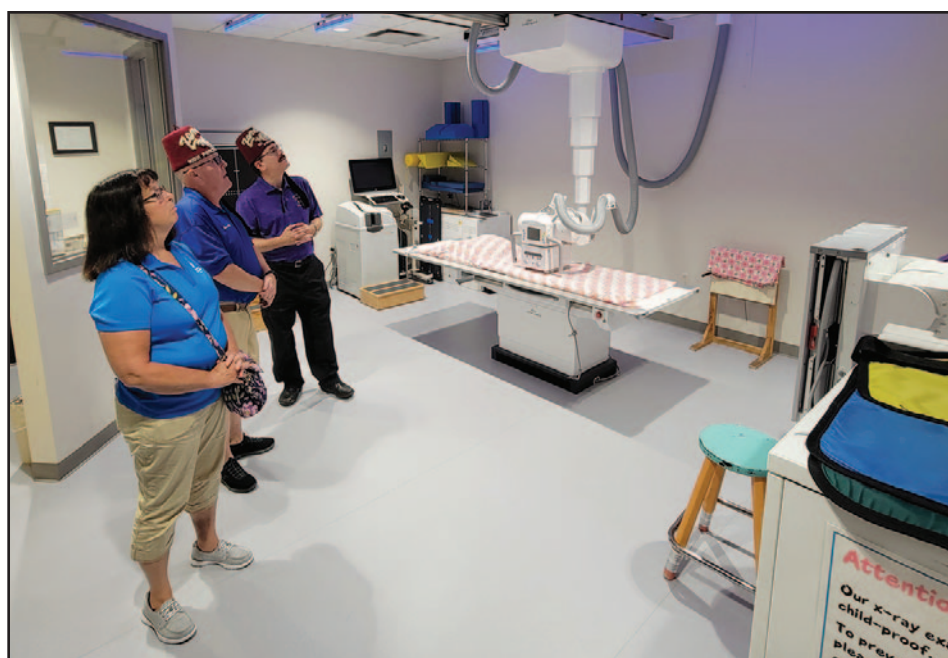

The young man is Josh Davis. Josh has cerebral palsy and a rare form of epilepsy. This caused physical and cognitive disabilities. When he was first diagnosed early in his youth, he and his mom were told he would never walk, but would be confined to a wheelchair the rest of his life! But then he was introduced to the Shriners Hospital System! Our Roadrunners transported him back and forth to our Chicago facility! It has taken many trips! Then two years ago he had his legs reconstructed and functional again! He continues to recover and is able to roam on his

'BEEPS' from the



Zenobia Jeepsters have been very busy with participation in about 20 parades and that many more to go. We average four to five Jeepsters at a parade and most communities give us a donation.

The Jeepsters received the most exposure at the fifth annual Jeepfest that took place on August 13. There were more than 70,000 spectators from over 37 states. Six Nobles were able to have their Jeepsters transport VIPs near the front of the parade, along with 1,400 Jeeps.

This year we did not lead off, as many VIPs were unable to get through traffic in order to ride in our Jeepsters. We had the same problem, but thanks to Assistant Director Gene Gordon, the problem was solved by contacting the police who summoned the Toledo Fire Department to escort the Jeepsters through the traffic mess.
