

Photo Tip Sheet – The Rule of Thirds

Improve the composition of your images by using the rule of thirds. In this type of composition, an image is evenly divided into thirds, both horizontally and vertically, and the subject of the image is placed at the intersection of those dividing lines, or along one of those lines itself.

Photo Tip Sheet – Resolution

Photos that may be used in print need to have high resolution, otherwise they are likely to come out looking blurry or pixilated unless they are used at a very small size.



Try not to use zoom (instead move closer to the subject), watch out for low light situations, and use at least 300dpi settings for submissions to the Hadji.


