

Next week, on Monday, April 8, we will all be witnessing an amazing natural phenomenon, a total Solar Eclipse. What's being dubbed as the Great American Eclipse will provide a great example of the finely tuned cosmos in which we live, move and have our being. As Masons, this should have particular meaning when we consider the letter "G" as discussed in the Fellow Craft

To exemplify this point, I want to share part of an article I came across recently.

'Since total solar eclipses are so rare and unusual, it's tempting to think of them as random coincidences of nature. But they're

nothing of the sort. In reality, they follow a complex pattern of physical and mathematical rules that makes it possible to predict their occurrence years in advance, as people have been doing since ancient times. This pattern depends on the sun, moon and earth having exactly the right size, composition, relative distance and motion with respect to each other. If there were any variation in any of these properties, total eclipses as we know them would never

These physical properties of the earth, moon and sun are part of a larger, vastly more complex pattern of cosmic variables, all of which must be precisely as they are for life on earth to exist. The odds of them all falling into place by pure chance is, in a word, astronomical. Taken together, they offer powerful evidence of what scientists call universal fine tuning. 



Ohio teen reflects on burn recovery nearly decade after explosion burned 87% of body

Seventeen-year-old Bryson measures his life by typical teen milestones – his first job, first high school dance, making varsity football, and getting his driver's license learner's permit. But for Bryson, those accomplishment are even more meaningful, when nearly ten years ago he was given only a 13% chance to live after a gas can explosion caused critical burns over 87% of his body.
