EULOGY FOR PAST POTENTATE JACK F. WOOD

Ill. Sir Jack F. Wood passed away on March 20, 2024, in Islamorada, Florida Keys.

Jack became a member of Zenobia Shrine in 1952, and in those early years was an active member of the Arab Patrol, drilling under the direction of Harold Wittmann. For a number of years Jack held the temple office of Marshal, member of Zenobia Divan in 1967 and served as Potentate in 1973. At this time, he was very proud to sign the charter for the formation of the Mariners unit, 80 Nobles, all members of the 100 Million Dollar Club. Jack was a Mason in Barton Smith Lodge, Scottish and York Rite bodies, member of ROJ Court #21 and Miami

Court #88.

Jack was a downtown businessman, president of Wood's Business Machines, member of Downtown Toledo Rotary, trustee of YMCA of Greater Toledo and member of Toledo Yacht Club.

Jack with his wife, Joy, moved to the Florida Keys in 1977 aboard their 30-foot cruiser "The Just Joy," a 2,600 mile boat trip! Jack will be fondly remembered by his family and many friends. Donations can be made in Jack's honor to Shriners Children's Hospitals. Jack was 93 years of age.

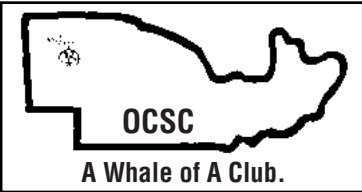
