EULOGY FOR BERNIE WELNIAK, P.P.

August 7, 2024, Freemasonry and all of us in Northwest Ohio lost a dedicated Brother, Shriner and great friend to all. Ill. Sir Bernard S. Welniak Jr., 33rd, moved peacefully on to the celestial lodge in the sky and is now greatly missed by all who knew him.


"Bernie" was raised a Master Mason at Barton Smith Lodge #613 in 1975, belonged to Fort Meigs Chapter #29, Toledo Council #33 and Toledo Commandery #7. He also joined Toledo Valley A.A.S.R. in 1975 and served as Sovereign Prince, Northern Light Council Prince of Jerusalem and was a member of St. Thomas Conclave – Red Cross of Constantine and Turkey Foot #253 A.M.D. In 2010, Bernard was coroneted with the Illustrious 33 Scottish Rite Mason.

Other groups and recognitions included: Past Chairman of Fallen Timbers DeMolay in 2001 and inducted into the DeMolay Legion of Honor; served as past president of GLSA Patrol Association (86/87), and past president of Ohio Shrine Association

(87/88). Bernie was an honorary member of many clubs and units, including a charter member of Zenobia's Legion of Honor. Bernie enjoyed the Arab Patrol Unit, a competitive drill team, and served as president (1982) and most recently as secretary. He also was a member of ROJ Court #21.

In 1987, Ill. Sir David Walker selected Bernie to join the Zenobia Divan line. He served as Potentate in 1993, with the motto "Answer the Plea in '93." Bernie and Dorothy were both quite active at Zenobia since joining, brought many new members to the group. Bernie was the Hospital Tabloid Chairman for many years and served as mentor to those who worked on the Tabloid later. He promoted the circus and was the top circus ad salesman for over 10 years!

Bernie was a strong promoter of Zenobia. During the past year, he was working to get articles printed in the newspaper about various Shrine events. He was a great spokesperson for the Shrine, always sharing the good, the activities and the hospitals.



He was loved by all with whom he came into contact, but mostly, he enjoyed being a Shriner.

We express our sympathy to his Lady Dorothy and are here to support her. Bernie Welniak will be missed by all who knew him. He will be remembered as a Brother, a Shriner and a Friend.



Six Jeepster members participated in the Port Clinton Walleye Festival Parade on May 25, 2024.








