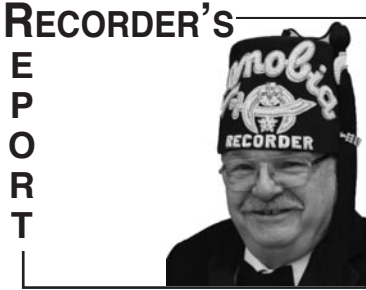
Hillbilly Notes

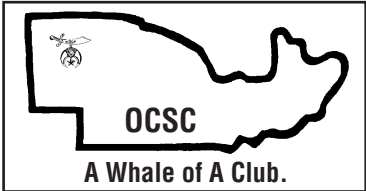

Abbey keeps dancing because care at Shriners Children's Chicago

Sixteen-year-old Abbey was just 5 when she was diagnosed with cerebral palsy, a disturbance in a child's developing brain that can affect muscle tone, movement, and coordination. Throughout Abbey's time at Shriners Children's Chicago, she has received therapy, braces, and a few surgeries to help her be as independent as possible.

Abbey's favorite area of the hospital is the motion analysis center which uses motion capture to measure how her joints and muscles work. Abbey's cerebral palsy mainly affects her leg muscles, but that has not stopped her from achieving major accomplishments.

"Dr. Peter Smith has steadily guided us into a world we never imagined," Vicki, Abbey's mother, said. "His skills and knowledge are second to none."

MOATAZ TAKES HEALING STEPS

Moataz, 9, came to Shriners Children's Chicago for inpatient rehabilitation and orthopedic surgery care as an international patient from Turkey. The child was trapped in a building during the earthquake that devastated that country in February 2023, killing more than 50,000 people. Moataz's legs were trapped and needed to be amputated. He had a complex case with infections and surgeries. It took awhile to obtain visa/permission to come to the U.S., but he arrived here in late fall 2023. Since then, he received care from Jeffrey Ackman, M.D.; Sue Mukherjee, M.D.; the POPS prosthetics and orthotics team, and rehabilitation therapy services. He loves soccer and got exposed to adaptive soccer after his prosthetist

connected him with a local adaptive soccer organization. His latest challenge is working on walking on custom prosthetic legs created by POPS. He was still learning when the board of governors hosted an ice cream social to thank hospital staff. He got to show some steps to Chairman Tracy Burcham and Assistant Chairman Keith Tuttle.

"He came here for rehabilitation and prosthetic fitting," said Dr. Mukherjee, medical director of rehabilitation. "There were some nutritional concerns at one point, but otherwise he has been well adjusted, very happy and cooperative and very hard working. He has done very well with his bilateral prostheses. His brother has been a great support to him."
