





February was a great month, with many activities taking place in and around Zenobia.





About Avanyah

Avanyah, 6, of Buffalo, New York is a 1st grader who lives at home with her mom. She has two pet guinea pigs, Mocha Mousse and Penelope. She enjoys painting, coloring and baking. As a lover of music, it's no surprise that her current favorite movie is "Wicked."

Avanyah was born with her tibia (shin bone) shorter than her fibula (calf bone). This condition, known as tibial hypoplaysia, resulted in her needing an amputation, in order to walk with prosthetics. After her early years of receiving care at another hospital and a surgery that didn't produce the results they had hoped, her



family was connected with Shriners Children's Erie through a good friend who had shared their positive experiences. After a year of having to use a wheelchair, thanks to the care she has received through Shriners Children's Erie, Avanyah is now back on two feet and on track to be in better shape than ever before! She is so happy to be able to walk again, play in the snow and go sledding. Now she is looking forward to spring when she will be able to visit the playground during recess at school, rather than sit on the sidelines.
